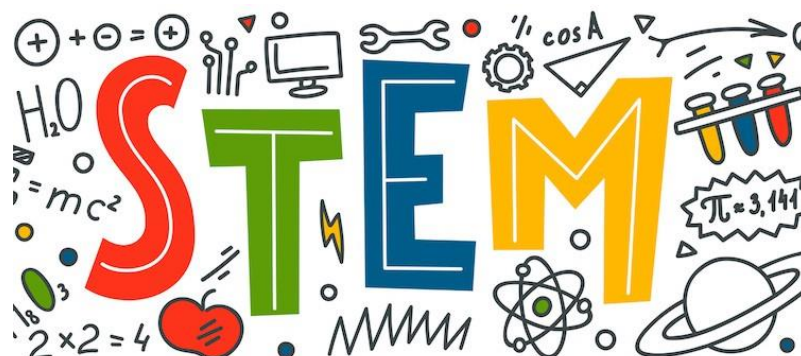

Over-the-counter medication must also be in the original container, clearly labeled and marked with the camper's name and dosage instructions.

I further understand that I will take full financial responsibility for all expenses which might be incurred. I hereby release whatever medical and dental information is deemed necessary and appropriate in providing the proper health care for my son/daughter. Such information will be regarded as confidential and shared with medical practitioners for emergency care only. This consent is given in advance of any specific diagnosis or treatment being required and is given primarily to encourage camp staff who have temporary custody of my son/daughter, and the said physician, surgeon or dentist, to exercise their best judgment in situations deemed an emergency as to the requirements of said diagnosis or medical, surgical or dental treatment.

DRESS CODE

Students will dress appropriately, in a manner that does not distract from the educational component of the *GEAR UP—Ignite Belief* summer camp. Any students that do not dress appropriately will be asked to change their clothing.

Ladies: **NOT ALLOWED:** backless, spaghetti straps, tank, strapless, one-strap, mid-drift tops, extremely short shorts, leggings, compression shorts, sliders, extremely short skirts or dresses. No see-through attire. Skirts and dresses must be no more than 3" above the knee. Shorts may be worn, but can be no shorter than the tip of the student's longest finger with the student's hand hanging at the student's side. This applies to the distance around the student's entire leg. If the shorts are shorter on the side of the thigh, the side of the shorts will need to reach the students longest finger with hands hanging to the student's side. Holes in jeans may not be above finger tips. No offensive language or images will be tolerated on clothing.

Gentlemen: Boxers and briefs should never be visible (no sagging shorts or pants). No tank tops, sleeveless shirts or muscle shirts. No see-through attire. Shorts may be worn, but can be no shorter than the tip of the student's longest finger with the student's hand hanging at the student's side. This applies to the distance around the student's entire leg. If the shorts are shorter on the side of the thigh, the side of the shorts will need to reach the students longest finger with hands hanging to the student's side. Holes in jeans may not be above finger tips. No offensive language or images will be tolerated on clothing.

Swimming Attire: **ALL** campers must wear a shirt of color (**NOT WHITE**) and shorts over their bathing suits in the pool. The bottom of the shirt **must** meet the top of the shorts.

Hats, scarves or other head coverings may not be worn in the building except for medical or religious reasons. This includes bandanas and sweatshirt hoods. Sunglasses are not to be worn in the building.

Spaghetti strap shirts, halter-tops and any article of clothing showing cleavage are inappropriate in the school setting.

Any apparel that promotes the use of alcohol, drugs, profanity, the degradation of an individual or group is unacceptable.

Students must have clothing covering the body from the top of the shoulders to mid-thigh. Stomach or midriffs must be covered at all times. Undergarments need to remain covered, this includes bra straps.

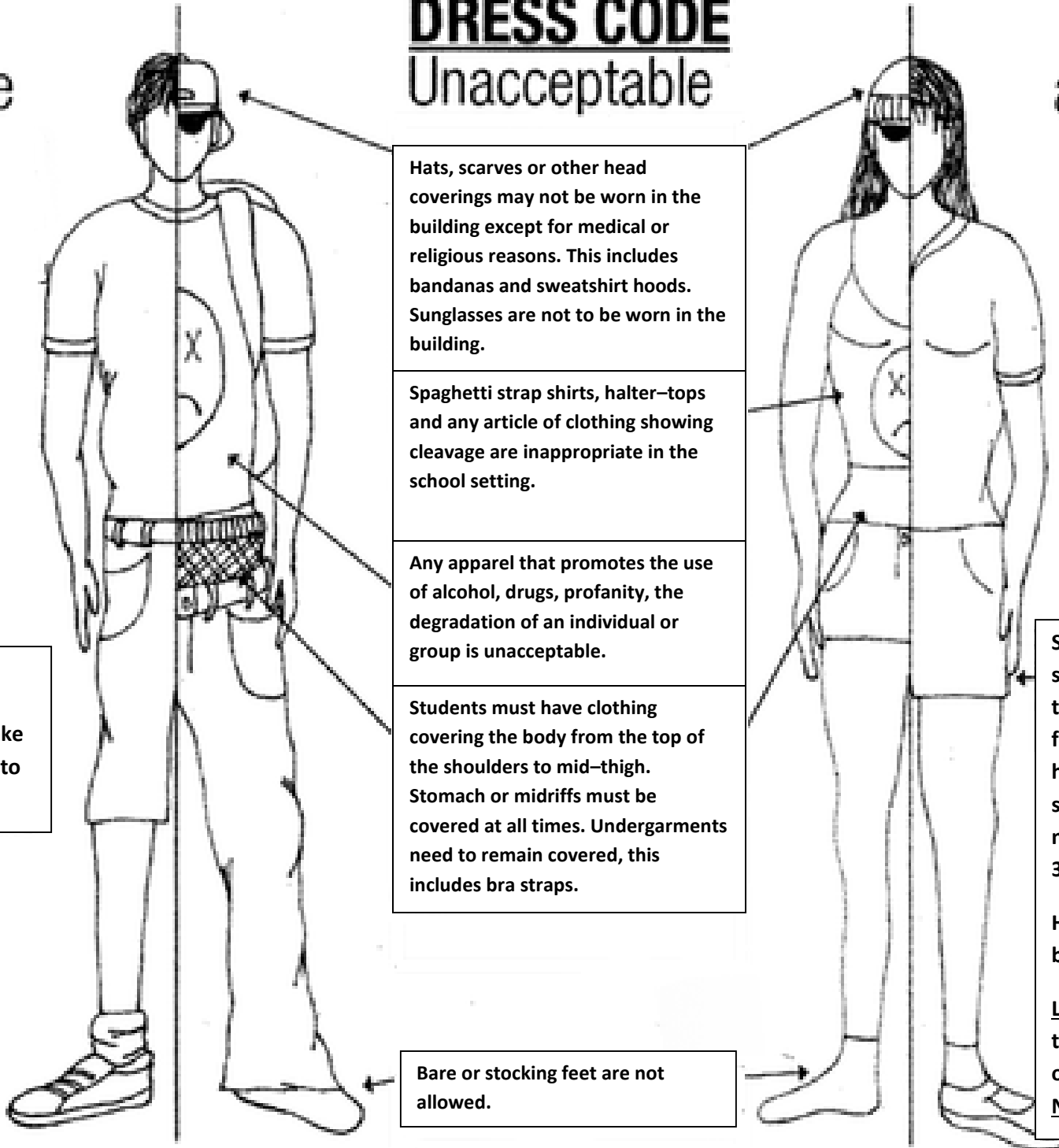
Bare or stocking feet are not allowed.

Students wearing items violating the dress code policy will be asked to make changes before returning to camp.

Shorts must **NOT** be shorter than the tip of the student's longest finger with the student's hand hanging at the student's side. Skirts must be no more than 3" above the knee.

Holes in jeans may not be above finger tips.

Leggings, Yoga pants, tight fitting sweat pants or sweats with flaps are **NOT** permissible.





MARIJUANA POLICY

Despite the passage of State Question 788, the use, possession, sale, or distribution of marijuana (including medical marijuana, edibles and products containing marijuana) on any college-owned or controlled property is illegal and against Eastern Oklahoma State College policies. Specifically, possession or use (including smoking or consuming) marijuana is not allowed on any college property (including parking lots) or at college-sponsored activities. Additionally, you may not come to class or work under the influence of any illegal substance, including marijuana.

Federal Law

Eastern Oklahoma State College receives federal funding through Title IV in the form of student financial aid (grants, loans, and work-study programs) and through federal research grants. As a condition of accepting those federal funds, Eastern Oklahoma State College is legally bound to comply with the Federal Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act, which mandates the implementation of drug prevention programs and prohibits the use of illegal drugs on campus or at college-sponsored events and activities. The college must also comply with the Federal Drug-Free Workplace Act, which describes the drug-free policies required at workplaces with certain federal contracts. Further, the college must also comply with the Federal Controlled Substances Act, which criminalizes the growth and use of marijuana and makes no distinction between medical and recreational marijuana use.

Medical Marijuana

Because marijuana remains illegal under federal law, even those persons with a valid medical marijuana license are strictly prohibited from using or possessing medical marijuana on the campus or property of Eastern Oklahoma State College or at events authorized or supervised by the college.

Disciplinary Actions

It is illegal for students, employees, or any other persons to use, be under the influence, manufacture, possess, cultivate, distribute, purchase, or sell any alcohol and/or drugs (illegal and/or dangerous or controlled substance, including marijuana) and/or any drug paraphernalia while on any campus, college-owned or college-controlled property, and/or at any function authorized or supervised by the college, and/or in state-owned or leased vehicles. Students and employees found responsible for selling or distributing marijuana on or off campus will be subject to disciplinary action(s); students and employees found responsible for using or possessing marijuana on campus (even those with a valid medical marijuana license) will be subject to disciplinary action(s); and, students and employees found responsible for using or possessing marijuana off campus (without a valid medical marijuana license) will be subject to disciplinary action(s). Violations of this policy are considered serious infractions. Individuals who violate this policy shall be subject to appropriate disciplinary actions. Student disciplinary actions may include warnings, probation, restrictions, educational courses, fines, suspension or expulsion. Employee disciplinary actions may include warnings, probation, restrictions, suspension, demotion, or termination.
